<p>For Terms 1 and 2 the teacher enters a percentage mark that reflects the knowledge and competencies that a student has acquired - based on the evaluations carried out during the term.</p> <p>In the case of English Language Arts, Mathematics and French, Second Language, a Subject Mark is calculated on the basis of the weightings assigned to the subject-specific competencies established by MEES.</p> <p>MEES = Ministère de l'Éducation et de L'Enseignement Supérieur</p>		<p>For Term 3 the teacher enters a percentage mark that reflects the knowledge that a student has acquired during the term and where applicable, for the year as a whole, including any board or compulsory Board or MEES exams.</p>	<p>It is calculated using the results of the two weighted terms (20%, 20% and 60%) and the MEES exam results (if applicable).</p> <p>*The MEES exam counts for 10% of the Final Mark in grade 6 English Language Arts and Mathematics.</p>
